What you could do:	How long it might take:
Help the Leaders run a game for Cubs	30 minutes
Help the Scout Leader pack the kit for camp	2 hours
Be on the Group Executive committee	12 hours a year
Be on the parent rota and help at Scouts once every half term	9 hours a year
Give the quartermaster a hand to check the kit back in after camp	2 hours
Help the Leaders run a game for Beavers	30 minutes
Be the Quarter Master	16 hours a year
Help run a specific Scout badge over 4 weeks	4 hours
Help run a Beaver craft activity	1 hour
Be on the parent rota and help at Cubs once every half term	9 hours a year
Drive your child to camp, round trip	3 hours
Run a game for the Scouts	30 minutes
Membership secretary – collect the subscripts at the beginning of each term	4 hours 30 minutes a year
Help the Leaders run a game for Scouts	30 minutes
Help on a HQ tidy up afternoon	3 hours
Mentor Scouts through personal challenges	6 hours a year
Be on the parent rota and help at Beavers once every half term	7 hours 30 minutes a year
Help the Group Secretary/Treasurer collate the Gift Aid data	4 hours a year
